


### **Chester Chatter**

# **Energy Breakthrough**



NGPS will once again be participating in this year's Energy Breakthrough competition held in Maryborough from Wednesday  $19^{th}$  to Sunday  $23^{rd}$  of November 2025.

#### Briefly

The Energy Breakthrough Challenge is a three-day event held in Maryborough in November each year. Each team comprises of up to 10 members of equal gender.

New Gisborne will participate in the Tryathon event in 2025. Students will maintain and race a recumbent tricycle throughout an obstacle course, sprint race and 8-hour endurance event. Students are also required to present their learning to a panel of judges in a 30-minute presentation.






