






# **Performing Arts - End of Year Concert**





# E-scooter Road Rules

Tougher penalties as e-scooters are made permanent.



### e-scooter riders cannot

- Ride on the footpath
- Use a mobile phone while riding
- Ride while under the influence of drugs or alcohol
- Carry passengers or animals or ride in tandem
- Ride a high-speed e-scooter, one capable of more than 25 km/h
- Ride on roads that have a speed limit over 60 km/h

# e-scooter riders must

- Be aged 16 years and over
- Not exceed the maximum speed of
- Ride only on shared paths and roads that have a speed limit up to 60 km/h
- Wear a helmet at all times
- Follow traffic rules
- Use lights and reflectors

### Water Safety in Schools – staff and parents/carers are eligible for free swim teacher training

Teachers and parents/carers are invited to complete swim teacher training. This is part of the Water Safety in Schools initiative.

### **Water Safety in Schools**

- The initiative aims to support students to develop core water safety competencies.
- There is currently a shortage of available swimming teachers. This makes it difficult for schools to deliver the swimming and water safety curriculum required in the Victorian Curriculum F–10.
- This course will make it easier for schools to deliver swimming lessons for students in need.
- Training is available for staff and interested parents and carers.

### **Teacher of Swimming and Water Safety**

Teacher of Swimming and Water Safety (TSW - SISSS00132) is a nationally recognised qualification.

Graduates will qualify to deliver swimming lessons as part of your swimming program, or work with local pools and swim schools. The course is being delivered on behalf of the department by Life Saving Victoria, Swim Coaches and Teachers Australia and AUSTSWIM.

### Our school is eligible

To access the <u>free swimming</u> instructor training course, staff and parents/carers must be connected to a government school that meets certain criteria - Our school has been identified school as eligible.



# Have your say on the Melbourne Airport Third Runway Noise Sharing Plan

Melbourne Airport is building a third runway to support the city's growing passenger and freight demands. As part of the approval process, a Noise Sharing Plan is being developed to help manage aircraft noise and ensure communities around the airport receive meaningful breaks from noise exposure.

The Noise Sharing Plan is designed to distribute aircraft noise more fairly during off-peak times and when weather and safety conditions allow. Rather than concentrating flights over the same areas, the plan proposes alternating runway use and flight paths to give residents across Melbourne regular noise respite throughout the day.

### Why it matters

The third runway will allow for an additional 136,500 aircraft movements per year, helping Melbourne grow to 76 million passengers by 2042. While this brings economic benefits, it also means some areas may experience more aircraft noise. The Noise Sharing Plan aims to balance operational efficiency with community wellbeing.

### How you can get involved

Melbourne Airport is inviting community feedback to help shape the Noise Sharing Plan. Your input will guide how aircraft operations are managed outside peak periods and how noise is shared across different neighbourhoods.

- Learn about the plan through fact sheets and FAQs
- View proposed flights paths around your area using the **interactive flight path and noise tool** to understand potential impacts in your area
- Attend upcoming person pop up and drop in sessions to learn more about the project
