Year Three

In term 2, the Year Three students have studied the topic 'Makanan', which has included learning about a range of different traditional Indonesian meals (makanan), vegetables (sayur-sayuran) and drinks (minuman). As part of this topic the students enjoyed a lesson in which they were able to taste a plate of nasi kuning (yellow rice), krupuk (prawn crackers) and a range of salad vegetables (sayur-sayuran).

Year Four

This term the Year Four students have learnt about different 'perasaan' (feelings). They have learnt how to express their feelings in Indonesian and the correct phrasing. They have enjoyed role playing these feelings and guessing them with each other too. The students also learnt the vocabulary to describe 'panca indra' (the five senses).

Year Five

In Year Five, the students have been learning about serangga (insects). The students have focused on all the body parts of the insects including describing the three main body parts of an insect the kepala (head), dada (thorax) and perut (abdomen). They used all their knowledge to create a Siapa Saya? (Who am I?) about an insect of their choice and write clues in sentences to describe their insects.


Year Six

The Year Six students this term have been writing their own stories which were centred around an animal theme. They were also required to use prepositions such as di atas (on top of), di bawah (underneath), di depan (in front of), di antara (in between) etc in their stories.
